- CHS International Baccalaureate Program- Presented by Avi Snyder, IB Diploma Coordinator, Social Studies and English Teacher
  - What is an IB diploma program?
    - IB is a rigorous two year program for 11th and 12th graders.
    - IB level classes carry a weight of 1.2 (like AP) and is eligible for college placement or credit
    - Students who successfully complete the program can achieve an IB Diploma

- IB Core
  - Theory of Knowledge Class
  - The extended Essay students write a 4,000 work research paper on a topic of interest
  - Creativity, action and service: Learn outside the classroom and reflecting on their personal growth through these activities.
- O What classes will they take:
  - Studies in language and literature
  - Individuals and Societie
  - Language Acquisition
  - Mathematics
  - Sciences
  - The Arts
- o AP and IB: What's the same?
  - Both are rigorous, college prep courses
  - Both culminate in assessment by a body outside of the school resulting in a score
  - Both offer the opportunity to earn college credit/placement
  - Both carry a 1.2 weight at Central
- o AP and IB: What's different:
  - Difference Mission: College Board's IB Mission
  - Differences in Assessment AP score -one test vs IB score multiple tests
