 - a. Central Administration needs input from parents as a Title One requirement on the following questions:
 - i. what are some of the barriers to student success within our community?
 - 1. Lack of transparency about precise community service requirements
 - 2. Need for more books- limited options in books for biology, math and English
 - 3. Computers for students without access
 - 4. Less homework done on a computer- can be barrier due to distraction on computer
 - 5. Guidelines for students on how much time should they spend on the computer etc.
 - 6. More access to museums in city to connect classes to experiences
 - 7. Need for high speed internet for students without internet access at home
 - 8. Late assignments assignments should not be given after 4pm at school and no late assignments given on google docs
 - 9. Why doesn't English department have more literature choices? parents are willing to donate books
 - b. What are some solutions to perceived barriers?
 - i. Having assignments available on paper for students who have learning differences or don't have a computer
 - ii. Survey students on which they prefer: paper or electronic assignments
 - iii. Approach Comcast Cares for funding for students in need of internet access- reach out to Bob Smith

- c. What barriers to student success do parents and families experience, and what do parents need to help their students achieve academic and social success?
 - i. Parents feel they know nothing about what is going on in the school
 - ii. Students are encouraged to self-advocate but don't get training
 - iii. Workshops are needed for parents to help them communicate with their children and understand their developmental stage
