2. Dr. Christine Soda- School Counselor

- a. The counseling department thanked the HSA for its financial and emotional support
- b. Central's Counseling department consists of 5 counselors for 2,400 students
- c. Department's focus has shifted from providing primarily college prep. counseling to student mental and emotional support
- d. School Connect Curriculum is used by the counseling Department- to provide support to students regarding mental health issues
 - Every student in 9th grade is exposed to the School Connect Mental Health Curriculum and includes a technology component and online activities for students
 - ii. Laptops for counseling dept. will enable counselors to provide the Student Connect Curriculum to all classes
 - iii. The counseling department would also like to bring in education and programing for parents regarding student mental health
- e. The Counseling department uses Naviance College and Career Readiness Technology Solution as their curriculum for college prep.
 - Naviance is a comprehensive K-12 college and career readiness solution that helps districts and schools align student strengths and interests to improve student outcomes and connecting learning to life
 - ii. Central counselors go to each senior history class and take one day to introduce Naviance to senior students
- f. Dr. Soda answered questions from parents at the meeting:
 - A parent expressed concern that families and students are not being made aware of alternate options to college, such as military service, trade school, police academy etc.

- ii. Dr. Soda agreed that more efforts need to be made to provide information to students on options other than college (e.g., gap-year programs)
- iii. Counselors need parents to share their contacts with Unions, trade schools etc.
- iv. The school needs to engage in a broader conversation about life after graduation
 - 1. Cost of college, debt incurred
 - 2. Intense push for kids to go to Ivy League schools/School culture pushes college rather than trade school
- v. A Parent asked Dr. Soda to address the change in college acceptance rates seen this year. Students are seeing a decrease in Colleges acceptance rates, which is putting more pressure on them.
 - 1. Dr. Soda's response: Counselors also saw a decrease in acceptance rates of Central students from University of Pennsylvania, Temple and the University of Pittsburgh this year. These schools are seeing increased applicants and are applying more stringent acceptance requirements.
 - 2. The counselors learn this information at the same time as the students and will be using it to counsel seniors next year about where to apply

3. School Updates-Tracy Scott

- a. Tracy Scott introduced- Rashida Hancock- Liaison with Philadelphia School District who was present at the HAS meeting
- b. Update of SAC- School Advisory Council
 - i. SAC is composed of community, parents, students and teachers

The District placed Central as a priority 2 school- this means that because Central has a strong HSA, which fulfills the district's requirements for a SAC

c. Graduation: May 31st all graduating seniors get 3 tickets; students can request from Pres. McKenna one extra ticket

- a. Title 1 is a School-Parent Compact- jointly developed by school, parents and teachers
 - i. Compact must be reviewed and discussed twice a year (Spring and Fall) --Compact goals are reviewed; feedback is solicited from parents
 - ii. In order to receive Title 1 funding parents must be engaged in the review
- b. HSA is asked to look at school, parent and student responsibilities and review:
 - i. The School District of Philadelphia Anchor goal
 - ii. Central High School's goals
 - iii. Parent Responsibilities

 - v. Communication about student learning
 - vi. Activities to build partnership with families
