#### Central High School – President's Report

- New Student Commons/Tutoring Center Room 237 -\$25,000.00 renovation being funded by an alum from the 208<sup>th</sup> graduating class
- Graduation will be June 10, 2020 at Temple University Liacouras Center
- Mid Terms January 21st 24<sup>th</sup>
- Parent Teacher Conferences are February 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> from 12:30 pm – 3:00 pm

# Parental Input from Last Year in Action

- Parents were concerned about security issues: cameras were installed in our school and more safety drills were scheduled and executed.
- Parents asked us to continue Emotional and Mental Health supports: we extended Mindfulness classes for all of our 11th grade students for 12 weeks during their health class. In addition, we added workshops for teachers, parents and assemblies for all grades.
- Parents were concerned about comprehensive sex education support: we have extended by one day the time we have our Health Resource Center open from 2 days to 3 days. Our resource person also works with our health teachers to support them with providing our students valuable information that they can use.

## Parental Input from Last Year in Action

Parents were concerned about student time management and other executive functioning skills. Our counselors have increased their visits throughout the year with our 9th and 10th grade advisories. This allows them to teach skills that will help to alleviate some of the stress that they may experience during school. Our counselors will provide students with resources that they can use throughout life.

Parents were concerned across content areas that teachers were not providing all students with the same skills they need to successfully move to the next course. This year, we have instituted common planning time to allow teachers to work together by subject area to uniform the skills they need to move to the next course of study and plan lessons together.

# Central HS: Keystone Data for '18 – '19

- 281: Biology 603 test takers 95.9% passed the assessment (22 students entered Central already passing this Keystone). Total % of 281 passing the Biology Keystone is 96.5%.
- 281: Algebra 1 224 test takers 91.1% passed the assessment (401 students entered Central already passing this Keystone). Total % of 281 passing the Algebra 1 Keystone is 96.7%
- 280: Literature 620 test takers Total % of 280 passing this Keystone is 99.5%



# Attendance:

- 85.6% of our students were present 95% or more days (SDP average was 46.3%).
- Currently for the '19-'20 school year 86.2% of our students have been present 95% or more days.
